Introductions

Meeting attendees introduced themselves and their roles.

Parish Update & Priorities/Fr. K

- Updates to parish events calendar needed for second-half 2023-2024 fiscal year.
- Input needed to assess possible changes to weekend Mass schedules.
- Chair and Team needed to manage 2024 Garage Sale

Potential Changes Discussed

- Number and timing of weekend Masses
- Scheduling annual fundraising appeals
- Planning for church festival

Strategic Planning - Review of Parish Survey Results from January/Zach N & Ivan P

- Overall high satisfaction rating around 90%
- About 50% of respondents provided recommendations
 - o Not enough data for statistical significance, so need to rely on judgment.
- Some "easy wins" are possible by addressing common requests.

Strategic Planning - Benchmarking Interviews with Other Churches/Mike W

St. Gabriel's of Hopkins, MN

- Pre-pandemic attendance was ~600 weekly attendees, getting close to that number.
- Very engaged Hispanic population and strong community outreach.
- Struggling with youth ministry and faith formation.
- Recently consolidated with another parish, so their focus is on becoming one community again.

St. Edward's of Bloomington, MN

- About 1200-1300 member households, 3000 total members.
- Seeing slow decline since pandemic.
- Financially challenged by loss of older donors and lack of younger giving.
- Completed strategic plan recently, hired planning consultant.
- The biggest challenge is engaging the next generation and youth.

St. Patrick's of Oak Grove, MN

- Listed 2200 members, about 1000 active.
- Attendance down 20% post-pandemic.
- Finance committee supportive but have infrequent meetings.
- Do not have parish council yet.
- New pastor and staff, so a lot of transitioning.
- Struggling financially and with capital needs.

Key Church Interview Takeaways

- Attendance and engagement are down across most churches post-pandemic.
- Attracting and retaining youth and young families is a common challenge.
- Many churches face financial struggles and inflation impacts on giving.
- Leadership transitions and lack of volunteers are pain points.
- Outreach and service are strengths for engaged parishioners.

Next Steps for February Meeting:

- Break into subgroups by topic to provide recommendations:
 - Festival planning
 - Future of nativity scene (Diorama)
 - Weekend Mass schedule.
- Gather more data from parishioners on proposed Mass changes.
- Share recommendations with Father Kuss before next meeting.
- Continue benchmarking interviews.
